

NB Power is postponing a bid for a rate increase for 2020-21, and its request to implement smart meters in the province. The utility asked the New Brunswick Energy and Utilities board to delay releasing its decision on a proposed rate increase of 1.9 per cent and proposed \$92 million rollout of advanced metering infrastructure. *Read more*
