Green energy focus for Eastern premiers, deal between utilities

A recent meeting of the Council of Atlantic Premiers was dominated by the need for more green energy in the region as efforts intensify to reduce carbon emissions, and featured a discussion with Québec Premier François Legault over opportunities to develop, transmit, and exchange clean energy resources such as hydro-electricity.

The meeting followed on the heels of NB Power and Hydro-Québec signing deals that will boost electricity sales to New Brunswick and provide help for the looming refurbishment of the Mactaguac dam near Fredericton. *Read more*
